PROGRAM AT-A-GLANCE		
LOCATION	Melbourne, Australia is one of the world's most livable cities and one of its most multicultural. It is Australia's best student city – a safe and vibrant metropolis offering world-class education, located in a region which is rapidly becoming a hub for education, research and collaboration.	
HOST INSTITUTION(S)	The University of Melbourne is a leading center for higher education and research in the Asia-Pacific region. It is ranked the number one university in Australia, and 13 th in the world (QS World University Rankings 2025). The University's contribution to new knowledge and ideas has helped shape the City of Melbourne over the past 170 years. It is home to a vibrant medical precinct , a world-famous artistic community, a thriving start-up network, and urban and rural researchers whose cutting-edge work on sustainability will shape the future of our planet. Yet, it maintains a true sense of place, recognizing the importance of the University's relationship to the traditional owners of the land on which our six campuses stand.

PROGRAM DATES	Semester 1 (Spring Term):February to JuneSemester 2 (Fall Term):July to NovemberAcademic Year:February to November
DISCIPLINES OFFERED	The Handbook is Melbourne's searchable database of all subjects. This is the best place to start when looking for subjects to study. Available study areas include: Agriculture, Land and Food; Architecture, Design and the Built Environment; Art History; Australian Studies; Business and Economics; Computer Science and Information Technology; Education; Engineering; Environmental Studies; Humanities and Social Sciences; Languages; Media and Communications; Music; Psychology; Sciences; Visual and Performing Arts.
COURSEWORK	CASA students enroll in four subjects for a total credit load of 50 points, with most subjects worth 12.5 credit points. All students must enroll in courses totaling a minimum of 50 points to receive full academic credit. Students can take any combination of subjects from any faculty , conditional on meeting pre-requisites. They also have the option to select one Masters-level course from a variety of disciplines, subject to approval. Please note that in Australia, individual courses are referred to as subjects and are thus represented in the Melbourne Handbook and <u>website</u> .
HOUSING	Apartments at <u>Student Village</u> on the doorstep of the Parkville campus and the heart of Melbourne.
INTERNSHIPS & VOLUNTEERING	CASA staff work closely with students to determine available opportunities which are aligned to academic and career goals. Students in recent semesters have found these opportunities to be extremely beneficial to developing their global perspectives and gaining cross-cultural experience in their field of study. Where they can receive credit at their home institutions, students are encouraged to enroll in a for-credit research or internships course. More information on placements can be found <u>here</u> .

HEALTH INSURANCE	All international students in Australia on a student visa are required by the Australian Government to have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) , from an approved Australian provider. OHSC will be arranged by CASA Melbourne and costs are included in the program fee.

HOW TO APPLY	 Open to students from all academic disciplines in good academic standing whose minimum grade point average (GPA) is 3.0 on a 4-point scale. Students should check with their home institution for their internal application process and requirements. Once approved by that institution, students will be given more information about how to directly apply to Melbourne for admission. Students can start their application at any time, and strongly encouraged to follow this <u>Step-by-Step Guide</u> which includes the online application link. 	
CONFIRMATION OF ENROLMENT (CoE) and VISA REQUIREMENTS	All participants will need a valid visa to enter Australia. Once your students' CASA Melbourne application has been accepted, they will receive a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) from the University of Melbourne via email. This CoE is essential for applying for the appropriate	

	visa to enter Australia. Most incoming students will apply for a <u>student visa</u> (sub-class 500, non-award sector). Visa applications must be submitted 4-6 weeks prior to entering Australia.	
TRANSCRIPTS	The University of Melbourne uses a secure online system called My eQuals to distribute e-transcripts to all students approximately a week after results are released provided there are no outstanding debts or withheld or incomplete results. CASA Melbourne will send transcripts directly to study abroad advisors at home universities.
